This includes all the accoutrements for Afternoon Tea: Teapot, teacups, saucers and plates; creamer/sugar, sugar spoon/sugar cube tongs, tea tray, tea strainer, lemon slice tray/lemon slice fork, tea sandwich or scone tray or plates--the list goes on and on.

We are looking for submissions that celebrate the craft of Afternoon Tea and all its glory. These items can be made in metal, clay, wood, or a combination of all.

Entries can be up to 3 pieces, showcasing the artist's individual style.

There is no fee to participate, but due to limitations of the BCAT gallery space, we may request that you send a smaller piece or less artwork.

- 1. Artist information: name, address, cell #, email.
- 2. Artist entry information: Lastname_image1, Lastname_image1detail. One detail image is encouraged. Images must be JPEG or JPG, at least 300dpi, and be no larger than 1800 pixels in any direction. Size (h x w x d"), name of artwork, media (if clay-please include body, process/firing methods, if metal or wood-please include technique/s), weight, price if for sale-or list as NFS (Not For Sale).
- 3. Artist statement-either about the artist or the artwork submitted. Limit to 1 page please.

Important:

- Each artist is responsible for shipping costs to and from BCAT. U.S. artists only please.
- We ask that entries be double boxed. No Styrofoam or dissolvable peanuts. Use bubble wrap or similar media. Please use boxes or containers that are re-useable.
- Artists who wish to sell work will receive 60% of the sale proceeds and the remaining 40% will go to BCAT.
- Please feel free to include any additional details or specific installation guidelines if need be.
- Please note that all sales of work are final. Work will remain in gallery for entire duration of exhibition.
- By submitting entries, you give BCAT the right to publish images of your work for publicity purposes for the 'Afternoon Tea' exhibition. (All credits to artist will be included).
- Checks for any sold work will be mailed to artists at the conclusion of the exhibition.
- Work not claimed within 30 days of the end of the exhibit will become the property of BCAT.
- Please do not submit work to 'Afternoon Tea' that has been included in other BCAT exhibitions.

*All work accepted for the exhibition must arrive ready to install. Works not gallery-ready or not exhibiting good craftsmanship may be omitted from the exhibit. Accepted work that differs significantly from the entry images or suffers from poor presentation will be disqualified. Please note that professional-level presentation and craftsmanship is a <u>must</u>.
